Part 1: Overview of causes why discipleship does not work

- 1. God wants us to <u>work</u> through problems, not run from them.
- 2. There may be temptations to <u>sin</u> put there by Satan.
- 3. There may be unresolved **problems**


from the past still causing present damage.

Counseling may be the key to understanding how to break these chains.

- 4. It may be <u>consequences</u> of my sinful behavior—past or present. Galatians 6:7-8
- 5. Person may have experienced God's <u>miraculous</u> deliverance in the past, then relapsed and now the person finds they are <u>trapped</u> again.
