# **Become a Talent-Plus Person**

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13

Many leaders today place too much emphasis on talent alone. John C. Maxwell, in his book, *Talent Is Never Enough*, argues that talent alone is not the secret to success in leadership. Maxwell asks, "*If talent alone is enough, then why do you and I know so many highly talented people who are not successful?*"

When people achieve great things, others will often explain their accomplishments by simply attributing everything to talent; but talent alone is never the answer. The lessons in this notebook are not anti-talent. Talent is a wonderful God-given gift that should be celebrated, but it is not enough for long-term success. In the beginning of a task, talent will give you a head start; but the advantage talent gives lasts only a short time. What separates the talented individual from the successful one is a lot of hard work. Some vitally important choices are required in order to convert talent into results.

Can anyone be successful? Where does talent fit in? Please consider the following statements:

- 1. Everyone has talent. All of us have something that we can do well.
- 2. Develop the talent you have, not the one you want. Focus on building your strengths.
- 3. Make choices that add value to talent. Destiny is not a matter of chance; it is not a thing to be waited for, it is a thing to be achieved.

#### **Belief Lifts Your Talent**

When people figure out their strengths, what often hinders them is not lack of talent but a lack of belief in themselves. When people believe in themselves, they unleash power in themselves that almost immediately takes them to a higher level.

Understanding the following three principles is crucial to becoming a talent-plus person:
1. Belief determines
A belief is more than an idea that a person possesses; it is an idea that possesses a person. If you want to achieve significantly in life, you must believe that you can. You need to expect to succeed. That does not mean you will always succeed. Sometimes you will fail; you will make mistakes. But if you expect to win, you maximize your talent and you keep trying.

## **Biblical Case Study: Paul (Philippians 4: 4-13)**

Paul challenged the Philippian believers to rejoice because of their relationship with Jesus Christ. He encouraged them to put into practice the things he had taught them and that they had believed. He reminded them that God would be with them to empower them to do those things.

Paul could challenge the believers to put their beliefs into actions because he – even while in prison – put his beliefs into action every day. With faith in Christ and bold expectations because of the Holy Spirit living within him, Paul focused on serving God by making the preaching of the gospel his primary activity. Paul became an unstoppable leader.

Paul, the man who willingly endured incredible suffering and persecution during the course of his ministry, demonstrated belief, expectations and results. He could rightly say, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (Philippians 4:13).
